SILVER BOW GEAR SWAP

I have my annual fly fishing gear swap coming up May 18th. If the club is willing to put a small plug in the Fly Leaf that would be awesome and help a ton!!

Here are the basics of how it works:

Fly Fishing Gear Swap Date: May 18th 9am-6pm

Sellers:

Bring in fly fishing gear starting May 11th. NO GEAR WILL BE ACCEPTED PRIOR TO THIS.

\$1 per item registration fee. NO EXCEPTIONS on bulk quantities.

If your gear sells you can receive 1 of 2 options:

- 1. 100% value of items sold as in-store credit
- 2. A check for 70% of the sold items value. Checks will be cut within 2 weeks after the event.

All gear MUST be picked up within 1 week after the event. Pontoon boats/float tubes must be dropped off and picked up the day of the event.

Buyers:

Event starts at 9am Saturday May 18th.

Prices will **REMAIN THE SAME** throughout the one-day event.

All sales are final.

Gear that is acceptable: Rods, reels, lines, waders/boots, clothing, fly tying tools/materials, pontoon boats, accessories, and anything related to fly fishing in good working order!!

FLY OF THE MONTH

Mini Black Hackle Peacock

May 2013

This pattern is a small, modified version of the well-used Black Hackle Peacock. It is a great small nymph for lake or stream when a small fly is needed. It can be tied using a bead head for faster sinking. Bluegills love it as well as trout.


Hook: 16 - 12 regular shape


Thread: Fine black
Tail: Black hackle fibers
Body: Peacock hurl

Hackle: Small black hackle fibers
Head: Peacock herl or small black bead



- 1. Pinch the barb, put the bead on *if* desired. Line the hook shank with thread. Tie in the tail fibers.
- 2. Form the body with peacock herl to about 2/3 of shank length.
- 3. Attach and wind the small hackle. Use the tying thread to make it point back to the tail of fly.
- 4. Form the head of the fly with herl on the front 1/3 of the pattern. Wrap a few turns of herl behind the bead, if used.
