Fred Muehlbauer Salmon Fishing on the Kodiak Island Road System Rivers



Fred Muehlbauer is a member of the Clearwater Fly Casters. He is a retired U.S. Department of Agriculture Research Geneticist and Plant Breeder who spent nearly 40 years in

the Crop Science Department at Washington State University working on dry peas, lentil, and chickpeas.

His angling time involves steelheading and salmon on the Snake, Clearwater, and Grande Ronde rivers, as well as trout fishing on local streams, particularly the St. Joe, and kokanee fishing. He'll be presenting on his Kodiak adventures, which began in 2002 and has continued nearly annually over the past 20 years.

Kodiak has a paved road system that provides access to numerous small rivers and streams, all of which have salmon including pinks, sockeye, chinook, chum and coho. The coho runs peak in September.

Fred will present on his adventures with fellow anglers on Kodiak, the rivers they fish, the methods they use, and the logistics of travel. It



should be an entertaining and dream provoking presentation for all! See you there!

# Not a lot going on around here, but...In other news in the region....

#### Montana

A closure on an 8-mile section of the upper Yellowstone River has been lifted now that a damaged rail-way bridge near U.S. Highway 89 has been removed.

The Highway 89 Bridge Fishing Access Site, which was part of the closure, has also reopened to public access.

The river closure extended from Mayor's Landing Fishing Access Site to Sheep Mountain Fishing Access Site. It was in place since July after significant flooding damaged the railway bridge, causing a safety hazard.

#### Idaho

Idaho Fish and Game will host spring/summer Chinook salmon public meetings in February. five public meetings to provide comments and opinions on how best to manage the 2023 spring/summer Chinook salmon fisheries in the Clearwater, Hells Canyon, lower Salmon, Little Salmon, and South Fork Salmon Rivers. Biologists will discuss what we learned from last year's Chinook salmon season, what this year's salmon return is projected to look like, and strategies we could use to manage this year's Chinook run. Local meeting locations and dates are as follows:

- Lewiston: February 16, Idaho Fish and Game Office, 3316 16th St.
- Coeur d'Alene: February 22, Idaho Fish and Game Office, 2885 W. Kathleen Ave.

Fumiya Okuyama, who currently holds several IGFA World Records, has added another to his angling resume with this impressive 20.15-kilogram (44-pound, 6-ounce) grass carp that has earned him the IGFA Men's 4-kg (8-lb) Tippet Class World Record for the species. Okuyama was fishing in Motoarakawa, Japan, when this grass carp struck his dry fly. Following a 20-minute fight, Fumiya netted the record fish, weighed it on his certified scale, and released the fish safely. Congratulations, Fumiya on another incredible record!

# **Confused about Thread Sizes nowadays?**

Time was, when it came to thread sizes, 6-ought was 6-ought. No more. Now we're all in denier sizes, and no-body can translate one to the other. Fact is, almost all thread manufacturers make different sizes and call 'em the same thing. Denier is the standard, though, between threads. It is the weight, in grams, of 9,000 meters of thread. It says nothing of the thread configuration, material, or strength.

Purple Haze Soft Hackle

#### February 2023

Kingfisher Fly Shop Missoula

Many of us love the Purple Haze Dry fly. Of course, it's hard to assess what specific mayfly it represents, but trout love it. Trout love soft hackles, too. That emerger stage of aquatic insects is a great choice in sparse or thick hatches, early in the hatch or late. Here's a soft hackle in the tradition of Sylvester Nemes which should claim some space in your fly box and some trout in your favorite water. Hook: Umpqua U201 OR TMC 2488 - #12-16


Thread: Danville 6/0 - Purple Rib: Turkey Biot Quill - Purple

Body: Hareline Dubbin - Purple & Hare's Ear


Hackle: Premium Hungarian Partridge, (self-obtained if possible)



Tie in your thread about a hook eye distance behind the hook eye. Secure a biot quill to the hook and advance the thread back to where the bend steepens.



Wrap that turkey biot on the flat forward all the way to the eye and tie off. Tie it as a wide rib leaving some space between wraps so the buggy looking dubbing sticks out and makes it look kind of messy.

#### **FFI Casting Instructor Certification**

Have you been thinking about getting your Casting Instructor certification, but don't know where to start? A good place to start is with the new CI Study Guide and getting yourself a mentor. More information on becoming a Certified Instructor can be found on the FFI website.

The actual certification process includes a required Teaching Workshop, Written Exam, and Performance Exam. The Teaching Workshop is offered several times a year and can be taken up to 2 years prior to the exam (recommended to take well in advance).
