FIN CLIPPING 2025

Our club showed up and clipped fins again this year on September 23rd and 24th. Along with volunteers from the Spokane Fly Fishers we clipped the adipose fins of 60,000 sterile female trout destined to be planted in Lake Spokane (Long Lake). The Rainbows this year came from Trout Lodge, and Avista paid for the fish as part of their mitigation for dams on the Spokane River.



Fin clipping is done to allow fishery biologists to determine the source of the fish as there is some natural reproduction in the lake.

Washington State Council Fly Fishers International Fly Casting Skills Development Program
Franklin Park, October 5th 1-5 PM

The Fly Casting Skills Development Program (FCSD) helps anglers at every level sharpen their skills, unlock new opportunities, and have more fun on the water—at their pace, on their terms.

Fly fishing is equal parts art, science, and humility. The Fly Casting Skills Development program (FCSD) is about removing friction from that journey. Most people quit fly fishing not because they don't love it, but because they don't get good fast enough. FCSD helps solve that. It gives anglers—whether you're touching a fly rod for the first time or chasing perfection after decades on the water—a structured path to competence.

The program runs on four rungs: Foundation, Bronze, Silver, and Gold. Foundation is where you learn the lan guage of fly casting: loops, roll casts, and basic accuracy. Bronze, Silver, and Gold are about leveling up—direction changes, distance, presentation. The results: More fish, fewer disappointments. And yes, there's bling: pins and recognition at each level, because achievement feels better when someone acknowledges it.

Important caveat: this is not about becoming a teacher. FCSD is not the instructor certification program. It's not an exam. It's a gym for your casting muscles. You go at your own pace, you decide how far you want to take it, and you'll know—by the tug at the end of your line—that it's working.

The secret sauce is starting at the beginning. Too many anglers want to skip to the sexy stuff. But most bad habits are born at the foundation. Fix those problems, and everything downstream is easier.

Bottom line: FCSD is the cheat code to more fun, less frustration, and better days on the water. The fish are waiting!

We are bringing back the Medical Lake outing again this fall after last years successful debut. Mark **October 18th** on your calendar and we will be watching the weather to make sure this happens.



FLY OF THE MONTH

Magneto Stone Steelhead Nymph October 2025

Tactical Fly Fisher

This is a recommended fly for the Grande Ronde and should reward you. This fly is tied by a number of fly tyers, but I found a good video that you can follow as you put this together.

It is listed as one of the top flies for both the Grande Ronde and Wallows Rivers. Try it out and let us

I know my past experience with stone fly patterns has been good, so I can only say this is certainly worth tying. The video is easy to follow and you can find it at the following site:

Magneto Stone Steelhead Nymph - Fly Tying Video

Hook: Long shank streamer size 8-10.

Bead: Tungsten 3.3 to 3.8mm.

Lead Wire: Lead or lead-free .020 to .025.

Thread: Black 14/0.

Rib: Brassie size silver wire.

Body: Black Fino skin.

Abdomen: Purple micro polar chenille. **Legs and Tail:** Standard rubber leg materiel black.

Thorax: Black polar chenille.



Start by putting on the bead and then place in vise. Wrap lead wire halfway down the shank, then coat the hook and end of wire with Zap A Gap or similar cement to keep the wire from rotating. Then finish wrapping the wire.

Start wrapping the thread near the bend of the hook. Now fold over a black rubber leg and attach it near the bend for the tail. Tie in the Brassie wire near the hook bend. Cut the fino skin in a strip about 1/4" wide with a bevel at the end. Tie it near the bend with the matte side up.


Now we tie in the chenille near the bend. Bring your thread halfway up the hook shank and whip finish or half hitch, but do not cut the thread. Spin the chenille two thirds up the shank of the hook, making sure the wraps are touching.

Pull your fino skin over the abdomen wrap and lock it down. Now wrap the silver wire around the fino skin and abdomen materiel to make a segmented body. Be careful in wrapping so that the shell back does not rotate on you. Pull your fino skin back and lock it down.

Add in two sets of rubber legs in the last quarter of the shank, near the bead. Have the front set pointing out while the set near the bead will point slightly back.

Tie in the black chenille and wrap to form the thorax. Make sure you make enough wraps to even out the taper. Now pull your fino skin over the thorax and tie it down. Now to make sure the shell back does not unravel, pull it back over and lock it down with a couple of whip finishes. Trim off the excess.

Apply Zap A Gap to the thread and make a couple of wraps, followed by a whip finish.
